Acorn/Birch Class Update

Acorns and Birch have had another great week of learning! After the success of our bird feeders last week, Caja showed us how to make popcorn and raisin bird feeders this week for the outdoor areas – lucky birds!

In maths, Acorns have been consolidating their knowledge of how numbers are made up and I've been really impressed how much they know already! Birch have been focusing on money, understanding its value and solving problems. Acorns have been busy writing sentences, using their phonics knowledge to spell words, while Birch have been writing speeches to present to King Charles II about the Great Fire of London!

During science this week, we have made our own rain collectors to see how much it rains over the next week and talking about how rainfall changes across the different seasons in the UK.

We had a great music session with Mr Harrison, learning about the musical dynamics of loud(*forte*), quiet (*piano*), getting louder (*crescendo*) and getting quieter (*diminuendo*).

Chestnut Class Update

In Chestnuts Class this week, the children have worked incredibly hard at producing an explanation text on 'How to grow your own garden'. They have used wonder detail, relative clauses, rhetorical questions, subject specific vocabulary and beautiful presentation! We can't wait to share them with you!

In Maths, the year 5/6 children have been learning about negative numbers and using different multiples to count through zero. The year 3/4s have been learning about Area. All good stuff! The Y5/6s have also been investigating pulleys in Science. We learnt about the reason why people use them and then investigated making our own – really impressive efforts by all!!

At the start of the week, it was a pleasure to take the years 1,2,3 and 4 swimming, where their confidence of being in the water blossomed and it was great to see their technique improving over the three days too. Chestnut Class Update

In Chestnuts Class this week we have started a new text – 'Tar Beach', where we have explored the main theme is freedom. The children wrote some very powerful sentences explaining what freedom is and used them to create a class poem. They have also freeze framed parts of the story and explained how the characters are feeling.

In Maths this week, the Yr 3/4's have been learning about how to find the perimeter of a range of shapes. Whereas, the Yr 5/6's have been developing their knowledge on converting measures such as millimetres, centimetres, meters and kilometres.

During their computing learning, the yr3/4's have been learning how to edit and use publisher to change font, size and colour. While the Yr 5/6's have continued learning about 3D modelling, where they created and designed their own chair.

Throughout their R.E learning this week, they have described, compared and contrasted the different types of marriage ceremonies that take place in Jews, Christians and Hindus, where it prompted some great discussion points.



Online Safety



According to the Roblox website, 'Roblox is the world's largest interactive social platform for play'. For those of you not so familiar with the game, it is a multi-player online gaming platform which allows children to play and create a variety of games in a 3D world. Roblox is free to play and available on all modern smartphones, tablets, desktops, Xbox One, Oculus Rift, and HTC Vive.

What parents need to know about ROBLOX

ROBLOX STUDIO

The Roblox Studio allows users to create their own games and 'worlds' for others to play on the platform. As the games are user-generated, it gives users the freedom to potentially include things you do not want your child to be exposed to, for example, weapons, violence and even pornographic content. There are no age restrictions on the games created in the Roblox Studio and Roblox can only rely on people reporting negative/violent content in order to remove the games from the platform.



CHATTING AND FRIEND REQUESTS

Whilst the games in Roblox are aimed at 8 to 18-year-olds, there are currently no age restrictions for signing up. This means both adults and young people can play and communicate with each other and send friend requests through the platform. Once a friend request is accepted, this means that they can communicate with each other outside of gameplay.



ROBUX ONLINE PAYMENTS

When a user creates a game, they earn something called 'Robux', which works as a currency within the platform, allowing the purchase of upgrades and memberships. If the created game is of good quality and attracts multiple players and in-game adverts, children have the potential to earn a lot of 'Robux'. Once a user has earned a certain amount of Robux, they can convert this to real cash and withdraw it to a PayPal account. To withdraw money, users need to be over 12, have a PayPal account and have paid for the Roblox premium subscription.

Top Tips for Parents



UNLIST SOCIAL MEDIA ACCOUNTS

Make sure your child's social media accounts are not listed in the settings/account info. If they are, advise them to make them private or remove them in their account. This will ensure nobody can find and contact them on their social media platforms outside of Roblox.

CHECK SHARED INFORMATION

In the account settings, check that your child is not giving away any personal information in their bio/profile. For example, their full name, phone number or email address. If you see that they have, explain why this is potentially dangerous and remove immediately.

2 STEP VERIFICATION

Roblox has a great 2-step verification security feature which we recommend you enable to add an extra layer of security to your child's account.

HAVE A CHAT ABOUT 'GRIEFING'

Griefing is when someone purposely upsets another player in a game. This can be done by setting traps, damaging or stealing something from another player, intentionally killing them and just generally messing something in the game for spite/competitiveness. Essentially, 'Griefing' is a form of cyberbullying and can be extremely annoying and upsetting for players.



IS YOUR CHILD UNDER 13?

Unfortunately, there are hundreds of YouTube videos showing children how to change their age settings on Roblox, so firstly, you should talk to your child to set up some rules/an agreement. There are additional safety features for children under 13, for example having their posts and chats filtered for inappropriate content and behaviour, so it is worth checking that your child has set up their account with the correct age. You can find this in their account settings.

DISABLE IN-GAME CHAT

Roblox is great for children to play together and chat to each other. However, if you wanted to completely turn off in-game chat for your child (meaning they could not contact anyone including their friends) you can do so by following these steps: When logged in, go to the Account Settings page by clicking on the gear icon at the top right corner of the page, then click Settings. Next, click on the Privacy tab and under 'Who can chat with me in game?' select 'No one' and this will disable in-game chat.

RESTRICT PAYMENT METHODS

Roblox is a free to play game, but there are still options to make additional in-game purchases. If you do not want your child to make payments, ensure your card is not associated with their account. If you are happy for your child to make payments in the game, but want to limit spending, we suggest using a games console gift card. These can be purchased in specific amounts, which will allow you to limit how much your child spends and removes the need for a credit/debit card to be used with their account.

Disney+ is the latest big player in the TV streaming market. The global brand has released its own subscription-based streaming service to rival that of competitors such as Netflix, Amazon Prime and Apple TV. As the name might suggest, it's designed to be family friendly, with content restricted to PG and PG-13 (UK equivalent 12a). It can be streamed on pretty much any device - mobile phones, tablets, PCs, TVs and games consoles - and features a huge library of classic Disney titles. Below, we've highlighted a few tips for parents to consider to ensure that their children get the most enjoyable experience out of the service.

5 TOP TIPS FOR PARENTS DISNEY+

1 Create a strong username & password

On its release in the US, Canada and Netherlands in November 2019, Disney+ was dogged by allegations of being hacked. Many users complained that their account details had been stolen and blamed Disney+ security. To date, Disney+ has confirmed there was no data breach from their end. As Disney+ doesn't use 2-factor authentication, anybody who potentially hacks your username and password could also access your credit card details. Therefore, it's important to create a unique username and a strong password that isn't used for other sites. Always use a mixture of letters (upper and lowercase), numbers and symbols and try to ensure the minimum length is 8 characters.

2 Monitor your child's usage

Whilst the ability to stream on almost any device capable of connecting to the internet might seem great at first, parents may also want to exercise a little bit of caution. Parental controls on Disney+ are quite limited and there are no settings to help with screen time or usage, so it can be easy for children to binge watch, particularly given the amount of content available. Apple, Google and Amazon devices all provide options to limit children's screen time so parents can manage how long their child uses the app.

4 Double check for films with 'outdated cultural depictions'

The Disney+ service includes programs and movies that go back to the 1920s and which have been left in their original format, with their original content. Some of this programming contains cultural insensitivities and depictions that were included in the original show, but Disney would never include them now. For example, cultural stereotyping, the representation of minority groups or character portrayals which may be deemed racist. For this reason, viewers are made aware through a warning message stating "This program is presented as originally created. It may contain outdated cultural depictions." Whilst Disney do their best to highlight any such content, it's always worth discussing these issues with your child if they raise any queries.

3 Enable 'Kid's Profile' mode

Although Disney+ is billed as family friendly, there is still an option to enable a 'kid's profile' which removes all PG and PG-13 rated content. This adds an extra level of safety if you're still concerned that your child may watch something that could be deemed too 'intense' for their age. Setting up a kid's profile also switches off autoplay which means the next video in any series won't automatically play once one episode has finished. It should be noted though that children can easily switch between accounts themselves given there is no security required to get into profiles.

5 Sit back and enjoy!

Above all else, Disney+ is designed to be family friendly and there is very little, if any, adult-themed content available for children to stumble across. The library of films and programmes can range from all-time classics to the latest Hollywood blockbuster and it can be a great avenue for parents and children to sit down together, ready the popcorn and enjoy some great family friendly entertainment.

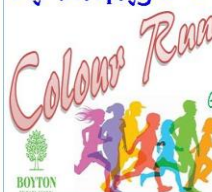
