Curriculum update – as you may be aware, we introduced 'Little Wandle' in the Spring term as our new phonics scheme. It is already

having a huge impact and children's confidence is blossoming. We are in the process of introducing 'Accelerated Reader' for everyone else. This is an ambitious scheme, which is designed to provide personalized goals for your child. Next week, the children will undertake a 'Star reading test' which will provide a baseline assessment. This is based not only on their reading fluency, but also their comprehension. They will then be given specific graded books to choose from which are perfect for accelerating their confidence in reading. (We may be seeking some help in labelling up our books according to the AR approach at some point!)

Finally, some exciting news! We have had an invite for some of our older children to join a trip to Somerset to watch a professional cricket tournament, with children from North Petherwin and Werrington primary schools. As soon as I get more information, I will let you know. Now that we are part of the Andaras Trust, I am sure there will be many more opportunities ahead! Exciting times!

Acorns and Birch Class Update

We have had a busy week in Acorns in Birch this week! Acorns have travelled to Australia and learnt about the different animals and landmarks there. As part of our geography in Birch, the children have been comparing houses in Kampong Ayer to houses here in the UK.

In maths, the year 2s have been persevering with learning how to tell the time to 5 minutes; this is a year 2 maths learning expectation, but it's also very challenging! Please continue to ask us what time it is at home! Acorns have been identifying patterns and creating their own repeated pattern rules. During English, Birch children are beginning to publish their stories after learning to use noun phrases and writing in the past tense. Acorns have been creating some amazing sentences in Drawing Club! In science, we have all been learning about the four seasons of the year and have been sorting different items of clothing into what we would wear during each season in the UK.

Our PE focus of athletics started off with moving at different speeds and distances, being co-ordinated while we move around others.

Mr Harrison has been teaching us about rhythm and pitch and we're learning a new song in music. We created symmetrical butterflies in Wild Tribe with Caja, looking at the natural world around us. Have a lovely weekend!

Chestnut Class Update

In Chestnut Class this week, in English we have been inspired by the story; 'Varmints'. Children have bee investigating different grammatical techniques such as fronted adverbials, dashes to show parenthesis and persuasive language to write diary entries.

In Maths, we have been learning about decimals. The y3s/ 4s have been learning about tenths and linking that to decimalisation. The 5s/6s have been investigating decimals up to 3dp - comparing, ordering and finding equivalence. Children have extended their knowledge by looking at reasoning and problem solving questions. It's been super seeing confidence growing.

During their Science learning this week, the Y5s/6s have been engineers- investigating the purpose of gears and even having a go at making a set. In year 3 and 4 the children explored how sound travels and how we can feel and see the vibrations.
