They used identification keys to name different types of trees, drew detailed drawings of flowers and ate their lunch under the trees in the woods!

We were visited by Mrs. Brewer, a teacher from St. Catherine's school, yesterday and focused on what strategies we can use to manage our feelings in different situations. We also had great fun finding the capacity of different sized containers and used lots of drama to explore a variety of feelings.

We have started a new geography topic where we are comparing where we live to a place called Kampong Ayer. We have made our own passports and will be travelling around the world over the next few weeks, finding out how different it would be to live in other countries and continents!

In Maths, building on our focus on fractions, we are now looking at tenths/ hundredths and decimalisation. I have been really pleased with the growing confidence children are demonstrating with this.
