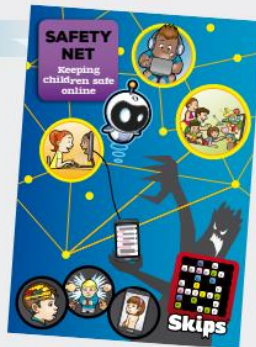

Chestnuts Class Update

Chestnuts have had another busy week! We enjoyed our PGL Day on Thursday and have been given lots of ideas of how to become Playground Leaders!

As part of National Science week, we talked about how many people stereotype scientists as being men in white coats with scruffy hair, holding beakers of liquids! In reality, this is not the case! We had great fun learning about the structure of solids, liquids and gases; the children split into three groups to show how these states of matter are made up and whether they move or not. The first group were a solid, tightly packed together and not moving at all. The second group were a liquid, a bit more spaced out and able to move around to fit their container. The third group were a gas and they were able to spread out all over the classroom and even escaped through the open door to the outdoor area! Great scientists!

We have done some wonderful things this week. The children have enjoyed welcoming some tadpoles to our outdoor area. We even had a chance to feed them!

Maths

Birch have been working on Fractions this week! They have worked really well on finding and recognising a half and a quarter of something. Acorns have been focusing on Subitising and recognising different ways a number can be made.

Literacy

Birch have started a new book called 'If all the world were...'. This is a beautiful book with lovely illustrations inside. The children pretended to be one of the characters from the story and wrote a diary entry. They really thought about their character and how they were feeling. We discovered what a kaleidoscope is too!

Acorns have been focusing on the book 'Tad' in our Drawing Club this week. They have loved drawing the tadpoles and following the story to find out they turn into a frog! The book has a lovely way of breaking down the life cycle process, so it is easier for children to understand.

We had Mr Harrison for an exciting Music lesson this week! Caja came to teach us PE on Thursday! The children have practiced such a beautiful dance, all about World War 1.

For PSHE this week Acorns have been thinking about Road Safety! The children role played what we need to do when crossing the road. Some pretended to be in tractors and cars. Birch have been thinking about money and where large amounts of money is stored. They role played writing a cheque for someone.

Make a Difference Become a Parent Governor



Why become a Parent Governor?

Governors have an important part to play in helping schools to run effectively. They work as part of a team with the Head of School and school staff to help provide a happy, safe and thriving learning environment and an excellent education for all the children.

As a Parent Governor, you will be well placed to understand parents' views and have first-hand knowledge of how the school is run. You will have the opportunity to work toward improving the school experience not only for your own child but for children in years to come.

This voluntary role can be challenging yet extremely rewarding and is a great way to build on your personal and professional skills. You will be supported in the role through training and mentoring allowing you to use your knowledge and experience to the full extent.

What will you do?

You will work with the Local Governing Body (LGB) to develop the school's vision and priorities, review educational performance and make strategic decisions.

Parent Governors are representative parents rather than representatives of parents. You will not be expected to gather the views of other parents and take them to Governors meetings or to personally become involved in individual concerns. You will need to be able to present a balanced and impartial view, based on the benefits for all children.

Local governor meetings are held three times a year and may be combined with school visits focused on school priorities. You will receive reports from the headteacher and senior leaders and need to be able to question, challenge and support decisions. You will also be expected to visit the school as a governor which can be a quite different experience to visiting as a parent!

The governing body operates a code of conduct which sets an ethos of professionalism and high expectations of governors.

What are we looking for?

We need enthusiastic and committed parents from a variety of backgrounds. You do not need leadership or education experience; just a desire to give back to the school and its community and a proactive approach to becoming involved as a member of a team.
