Chestnut Class Update

In English this week, the children have started looking at a new text called the 'Matchbox Diary', which will inspire the children to think about the main themes and use ideas and pictures to help with their own writing. The children have used freeze frames and drama to help show feelings and emotions. Please can children bring in their precious items, that can fit into a match box by Wednesday nest week.

In Maths this week, the children have looked at how to add and subtract integers by using the column method accurately. In Yr 3/4 the children have learnt about rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1,000. Children have used mathematical language to explain the knowledge needed to solve the questions.

During P.E this week, the children have developed their ball handling skills in both netball and rugby. There has been a specific focus on attacking and defending skills and making good tactical moves.

In Science this week, the Yr 3/4 pupils designed a bionic hand, which they will be making next week. Whereas, the Yr5/6 have learnt about the eye and how it functions – learning amazing facts too!














Advice for Parents & Carers

SET PARENTAL CONTROLS

Roblax comes with several parental control options, which are explained well on the garme's official website. If sessent if to senter the correct date of birth for your child, as that allows Roblax to automotically apply the appropriate charfilhers. The game also allows parents and correct to set monthly spending restrictions and monitor their child's account.

DISABLE PRIVATE MESSAGING

Roblox's private messaging function raises the risk of children being contacted by people they may not want to speak with "potentially leading to bullying, horessment, toxicity and scam attempts. The game allows you to disable messages from anyne who hasn t been added as a friend on your child's account.

PRIVATE SERVERS

If your child has some genuine friends to play hobbar orline with, paying for a private or VP server decreases the risk of contact from strangers. Even then, however, some players could invite other people — who might not necessarily be child friendly—into the private server. If your child is a Robbar (fan, it's important to talk with them regularly about who they are playing the game with.

MONITOR SPENDING

If they don't understand they're using real money, it's easy for children to accidentally spend a skeable amount in the game. Using parental controls to place limits on their spending will help avoid any nasty financial surprises. Ensuring that you have two-factor authentication on your payment accounts also makes it harder for your child to spend money inadvertenity.

DEALING WITH STRANGERS

At some point in their development, your child will need to learn how to deal with strangers online. Show them how to block and report any users who are upsetting them or asking uncomfortable questions. Talking to them about what's OK to discuss—and what they should never tell a stranger online—will help them understand how to communicate with other people online safely.




