Acorn/Birch Class Update
Acorns and Birch have been embracing their learning this week, looking closely at how penguins

are adapted to living in Antarctica and how we adapt to seasonal changes.

Acorns have been reading "Tiddler" and retelling the story using props and small world animals, while Birch children dressed Charlotte up as a penguin! We gave her a thick layer of fat, a layer of oily feathers, some webbed feet and then checked that she was waterproof by spraying water on her! She stayed completely dry and was very warm, too! Perfectly adapted to live in Antarctica! In maths, Acorns have been counting up to 5 and understanding that the last number that we count is the total number of objects. Birch have been busy using place value charts to partition numbers into tens and ones, and number lines to estimate where numbers will sit. We still need to practise counting up to 100 in ones and tens, so would be grateful if you can help us at home with this – thank you!

We had another great music lesson with Mr. Harrison and enjoyed gymnastics with Caja again, using the wall apparatus to move around and balance.

Please remember to choose a reading book to share with your child as often as you like and thank you for listening to your children read at home.

Chestnut Class Update

We have been inspired by the Cornish tale, 'The Merrymaid of Zennor'. In English this week, the children have learnt how to use apostrophes and brackets through retelling the story from the Mermaid's perspective, Also, we have created a leaflet persuading people to visit Zennor, where a church pew has a very intriguing carving of the mermaid.

In Maths, the Yr 3/4 children have started a new topic of Multiplication and division, where they have learnt about arrays and how to share and group numbers. Please can we encourage children to practice their times tables using Times table Rockstars. The Yr 5/6 children have continued to learn about fractions and how to order, add and subtract fractions with different denominators.

In Science this week, the Yr 3/4 children have learnt all about sugar and how much is contained in a variety of drinks. We looked at food labels and worked out how many teaspoons where in each. While the Yr5/6 children studied diagrams and symbols of electrical circuits = discussing whether they would work.


