Acorn/Birch Class Update Acorns and Birch have enjoyed learning about the Lunar New Year this week! They have been

Acorns and Birch have enjoyed learning about the Lunar New Year this week! They have been scribing Chinese number symbols and decorating snakes, this year's Chinese zodiac animal. The children tested their skill at using chopsticks to eat noodles – there were lots of resilient rhinos refusing to give up that task!

Acorns have been reading George and the Dragon in Drawing Club this week and have created some amazing stories of their own. Birch have started to write their own versions of a narrative, using verbs and adjectives in their writing.

In maths, Acorns have been looking closely at what 3, 4 and 5 are made up of, finding parts of the whole number. Birch have been resourceful red squirrels and used manipulatives such as base 10 and counters to help them to add and subtract 2-digit numbers.

Ask Birch children about what they have learnt about Neil Armstrong and what his famous words were when he stepped onto the moon in 1969!

In science, we have made our own parachutes, thinking carefully about what materials to use. Thank you for listening to your children read every day at home – please remember to choose a book with your child to share together at home from our basket or bookshelves.














Chestnut Class Update

In English this week, the children have been using the picture book 'The Whale' to write a film pitch. They have taken different writing techniques learnt such as conjunctions, building tension and using emotions as fronted adverbials. The children have worked hard at choosing a range of devices to make their writing detailed and interesting.


In Maths this week, the Yr 3/4 children have come to the end of the division and multiplying unit. They have divided three - digit numbers with exchange and remainders. They have answered true and false questions to help with reasoning and explaining answers. Whereas the Yr 5/6 children have learnt how to order decimals and round the decimals to a range of places.

In Science this week, the Yr 3/4 children had a go at making ice-cream with strawberry milkshake and ice. The children have developed their understanding of how liquid changes into a solid and the process it goes through. Whereas the Yr 5/6 children have been learning about adaptations in plants, which allows them to survive in different environments. The children explored how cactuses survive in the hot, dry desert.


In PSHE this week, the children have learnt about habits and what photos can be shared online.

- NEVER post invitations unless you are absolutely sure they will only be seen by a closed group

Are they real?

- . Do you know this 'friend' in real life?
- Are you REALLY sure it's their account, not someone pretending to be them?
- Remember: some people are VERY clever at pretending to be someone they're not!

Feeling uncomfortable

- DON'T reply to trolls or people making unkind comments
- Don't be afraid to 'unfriend' or block people who upset you
- Do REPORT people if necessary
