This week's focus

This week, our focus across both classes has been to be a reflective learner.

What is a reflective learner?

A "reflective learner" means a student who actively thinks about their own learning process, analyzing what they are learning, how they are learning it, and how they can improve by considering their strengths and weaknesses, essentially taking time to "reflect" on their experiences to better understand and apply new knowledge.

By developing reflection skills, children are learning that they can always improve, no matter how fantastic their learning has been. They are also learning to value and learn from mistakes and see them as part of the learning process.

Acorn/Birch Class Update

Acorns and Birch have had a fantastic first week back with some great learning from our 'Reflective robins'. As part of our Geography learning all about farming and where our food comes from this half term, Acorns have been creative using different vegetables to make prints. Birch have talked about how dairy products contain milk and where that milk comes from, as well as its journey to our homes.

Acorns have created some brilliant versions of the Three Little Pigs story in Drawing Club and have started to write their own sentences this week! Birch have been retelling the story of Beegu in English, using adjectives, past tense verbs and the conjunctions 'and' and 'but'.

In maths, Acorns have been finding out how 6 and 7 are made and Birch have been learning about multiplication by finding equal groups.

We all enjoyed our Wild Tribe afternoon with Belinda! We became explorers and helped her to find things that she'd lost from her backpack! We also explored the hedges around the school field, looking for signs of spring, like buds and flowers. We finished off by making a fire in the Kelly kettle and had a hot chocolate to warm us up!

Chestnut Class Update

In English this week, the children have continued exploring the text- 'High Rise Mystery' where they have taken inspiration from the text to write their own detective story. The children have decided on a location that they can describe and have included two children that are detectives that help the police with their investigation. The children have used different writing techniques to extend their sentences and using a range of punctuation.

In Maths this week, the Yr 3/4 children have started a new focus of fractions and have understood what denominators and numerators are. They have answered problem solving and reasoning questions too. Whereas the Yr 5/6 children, have had a focus on decimals and adding and subtracting. During the Science learning this week, the Yr 5/6 children investigated the Weasley Family (from Harry Potter) and identified how offspring inherit different characteristics. The Yr 3/4 explored how they can group different animals under a range of headings.

In PSHE this week, the new focus for the term is Rights and Respect. The Yr 3/4 children learnt about safe places and how to keep each other safe. The Yr 5/6 had a focus on media and how newspaper headlines can affect children.

ASK THEM HOW THEY USE THE WEBSITES, AND TAKE AN INTEREST IN HOW THEY CAN USE THEM IN A POSITIVE WAY. ALSO ASKING THEM TO SHOW YOU IF POSSIBLE.

BECAUSE OF THIS THEY MAY STRUGGLE TO APPROACH THE NORMAL PEOPLE WHO WOULD HELP, SUCH AS YOURSELF OR A TEACHER. HAVE A CHAT TO YOUR CHILD ABOUT EXACTLY WHERE THEY CAN GO FOR HELP, AND HOW THEY CAN REPORT ANY ACTIVITY THAT THEY BELIEVE IS INAPPROPRIATE ONLINE.

CHILDREN MAY NOT UNDERSTAND THE NEGATIVE IMPACTS OF DEVICE OR GAME ADDICTION. TALK TO THEM OPENLY ABOUT HEALTHY HABITS AND ASK WHETHER OR NOT THEM SPENDING TIME ONLINE OR PLAYING A GAME IS AFFECTING THEIR SLEEP, PERFORMANCE AT SCHOOL, OR IF THEY ARE GENERALLY LOSING INTEREST IN OTHER ACTIVITIES.
