We had a huge collaborative effort to build towers and buses with the large colourful 3-D soft shapes, and lots of exciting water play made our plants very happy indeed!

On Friday, we started learning about how birds take care of their young in the Springtime, by building our own nests from wool and lots of incredible gluing skills. The results will be revealed next week, when we will hopefully be sending them home with an Easter treat inside!

Acorn/Birch Class Update

Acorns and Birch have had a great week of learning! They decorated pebbles in their Wild Tribe session with Belinda and made chalk drawings of themselves on the playground. During maths, Acorns have been exploring how 8 is made and have been counting objects wherever they go! Birch have started to learn about measurement, using objects such as their hands and cubes to measure things around the classroom, then moving on to using centimetres and metres to make accurate measurements.

Acorns have been reading The Tiger Who Came to Tea in Drawing Club and have been writing their own sentences to explain what's happening in their drawings. Birch children have finished making their pouches in DT this week – they are fantastic!

Chestnut Class Update

In English this week, the children have used the 'The Lost Thing' book and video to help inspire their own story. They have created their own 'Lost Thing' story, based in a different setting and have used writing techniques they have learnt such as fronted adverbials, dashes and expanded noun phrases. The children have worked incredibly hard at editing and publishing their stories to be the best they can.

In Maths this week, the children have shown great resilience at tackling end of term assessment paper, where the children have tackled arithmetic and reasoning and problem -solving questions with great accuracy.

During the Science learning this week, the Yr 3/4 children have explored how food chains work and the difference between producers, prey and predators. Whereas the Yr 5/6 children have researched and planned out information on evolution – ready to write an explanation text next week. The Yr 5/6 children had a brilliant opportunity to visit Launceston College on Wednesday, where they took part in team building, P.E activities and adventure activities. It was great seeing the children work together and thinking about how they worked in groups, which links to our capability curriculum. Have a lovely weekend!


