Chestnut Class Update

During our Maths learning this week, the Yr 3/4 children have explored capacity and the difference between millilitres and litres. They have done a range of practical work and partner work to help develop their understanding and how to use their knowledge to solve reasoning and problem-solving questions. Whereas the Yr 5/6 children have been leaning all about percentages! They have focused on how they relate to decimals and fraction, how to find percentages of an amount and how to use percentages in context,

The children have had a great week swimming, where they have gained confidence in the water and improved their swimming technique in a range of strokes. They have enjoyed collecting weighted sticks from the pool floor, jumping in from the side of the pool and used a range of floats to help them float.

During their PSHE learning this week, for all the children they were exploring terms such as money, credit, debt and how to spend money wisely. They had discussions on how they could make money and what kind of jobs they could do around the house to earn those pennies!

Well done to the children that took part in Song Fest! They have worked hard at learning the songs and did a great job on Tuesday evening. Have a lovely Easter holiday.











Social Media Settings

A Philop

(recommended: on)

Yost social media apps are 13+ (WhatsApp is 16+) but - as we are aware some children are using them regularly - we wanted to share some important settings to keep children safe online.



You can also restrict, block or report a user by clicking on their profile and selecting the three dots in the top right. You can also remove a follower using this method.



PRIVATE ACCOUNT: when this is on, only followers can see your posts and you have to approve followers (recommended: on)

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SAFETY: Tiktok has lots of options to restrict contact and interaction with video posts (recommended: friends)

COMMENT FILTERS: you can automatically hide comments that may have offensive words in (recommended: on)

You can also block, report or remove a follower by clicking on their profile and clicking the three dots in the top right hand corner.



PROFILE PHOTO AND STATUS: You can change who can see a profile photo and status (recommended: my contacts)

GROUPS: allows you to stop a contact being able to add you to groups (recommended for when a friend adds you without permission)

BLOCKED: can add a contact to a blocked list so they can't message you.

You can also block or report a contact/ number by clicking on the chat with them, clicking on their number/name at the top then scrolling down!



CONTACT: decide who can message you and send you snaps (recommended: my friends)

VIEW MY STORY: restrict who can see your story (recommended: my friends)

GHOST MODE: if this isn't on, contacts can see your location on a map (recommended: on)

You can also block or report a user by locating their contact, tapping and holding their name and clicking more

Cornwall had an earthquake and nobody even knew it



verv faint earthquake hit Cornwall last month - so small that nobody even noticed it. According to the British Geological Survey, the 0.9 magnitude quake occurred close to the Devon border.

Recorded in Boyton, Cornwall, around six miles north of Launceston, it happened at 4.18pm on Sunday, February 9. While not unheard of for Cornwall to see small earthquakes, this makes it the first one for 2025



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AUTUMN TERM (74 days) 3 September - 20 December 2024

HALF TERM 28 October -1 November 2024)

SPRING TERM (60 days) 6 January - 4 April 2025 (HALF TERM 17-21 February 2025)

SUMMER TERM (61 days) 22 April - 23 July 2025 (HALF TERM 26-30 May 2025)

195 days are included on the school calendar. Schools will be open to pupils for 190 days. The five additional days are allotted for In-Service Training (INSET). Schools allocate their own INSET days.



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
