# **Acorn/Birch Class Update**

What a fantastic first full week back we have had! I would like to welcome the new members of our class and have been so impressed with how quickly they have settled into the routines of Acorns and Birch Class.

Our new reception children have been learning their first set 2 sounds in phonics and have enjoyed reading The Colour Monster in Drawing Club. Birch children have been focusing on our new book, Grandad's Camper and have been finding adjectives to describe Grandad's memories and using commas in a list. In maths, Acorns have been subitising up to 3 and counting up to 10. Birch have been counting up to and back from 100 in ones and tens and subitizing up to 5.

We all enjoyed our visit to the Sustainability Centre on Wednesday where we learnt all about the four things that are essential for survival. We made wooden medallions, stinging nettle syrup and lit our own fires to cook our nettle leaves.

In PE, we have been learning to reach a target with a ball by having control in the way we roll it. We also had a great first music lesson with Mr Harrison!

# **Chestnut Class Update**

During our English this week, we have started exploring a new book 'The Seed of Doubt' and have used this as inspiration to think about our own dreams and aspirations. The children then wrote poems, which included figurative language about the tree of hope.

In Maths this week, the children have covered some key concepts including bar models, part whole models and place value. The year 3/4 children have had a focus on how to add three numbers, whereas the year 5/6 children have learnt how to show bar models with different number sentences. We have had a brilliant week with children from years 4,5 and 6 completing Bikeability, where they were taught how to ride safely on the roads and how to maintain their bikes. The instructor commented on how focused and polite the children were.

We had our first visit to the Woodland Skill centre, where the children had a fantastic day. They participated in a range of activities such as orienteering, collecting and eating nettles, making fires, drilling through wood. It was lovely to see the children so engaged and working alongside a range of years.
