On Thursday, the children baked some delicious iced fairy cakes. They all enjoyed getting involved with weighing, measuring and mixing. In maths, we have been clapping and stomping numbers up to five. In the afternoon, we played a magical game of pass the paper pumpkin! On Friday, we joined Birch class in a special day of outdoor learning and fun with The Three Billy Goats Gruff theme! Lots of teamwork and creativity encouraged (pictures to follow).

Acorn/Birch Class Update

Acorns and Birch have had another great week of learning! Acorns have been subitising up to four this week (knowing how many objects there are without having to count them) and comparing the weight of different vegetables. The Year 1 children have been writing 2-digit numbers correctly, understanding that the first digit represents the tens and the second digit represents the ones. Year 2 have been identifying the next and previous multiples of ten on a number line and have been estimating the length of a line.

In English, Acorns have been reading *The Enormous Turnip* and have been creating their own character and setting. Birch have started to read *Dragon Post* after spotting some suspicious footprints leading to one of our cupboards!

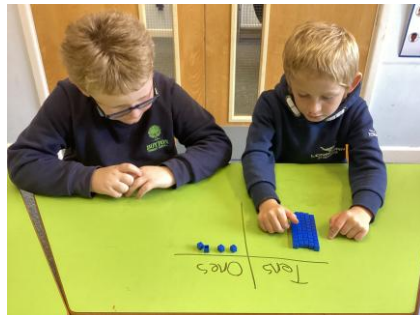
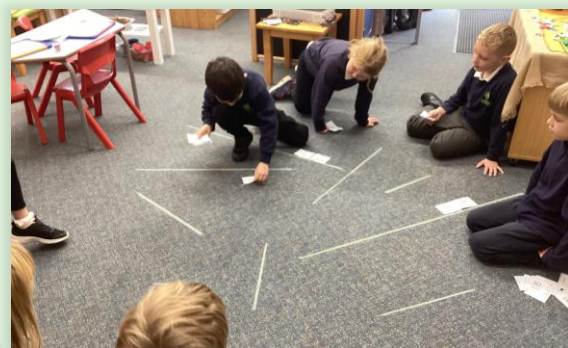
In Science, Birch have been investigating how exercise affects our heart rate and that exercise is important to keep us healthy.

Acorns showed some great teamwork and communication skills when faced with the task of moving the pumpkin from one place to another without it dropping to the ground and not being able to pass it to each other!

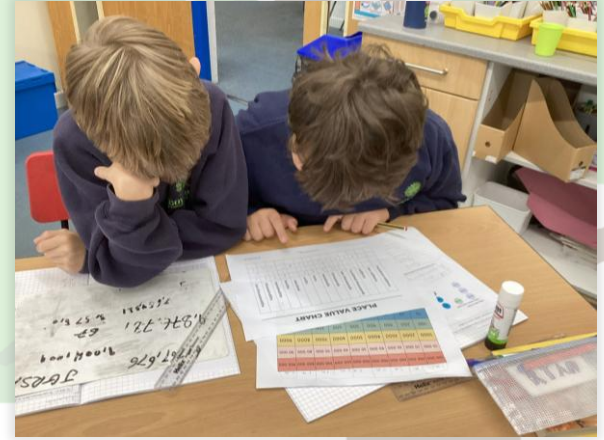
Chestnut Class Update

During the English learning this week, the children have started exploring a new book – 'The Last Bear'. This is a book full of adventure and curiosity as a Father and daughter embark on a life changing opportunity of spending 6 months in the Arctic circle. The children have written logs from April's point of view and used a range of writing techniques to extend their writing.

In Maths this week we have had a focus on place value. The Yr 3/4 children have counted in 10s across 100 and used base ten frames to support answers. Whereas the Yr 5/6 children have focused on numbers up to 10 million, where they have written, used place value charts and bar models to help support their answer.

In Science over the last couple of weeks, the Yr 3/4 children have learnt about pollination and seed dispersal. They have learnt how different seeds travel and how plants reproduce. In Yr 5/6, the children have investigated how substances dissolve and if melting is reversible or not. They have also explored about soluble and insoluble substances and how you can use evaporation to remove the water.

In Wildtribe the children have carried on the Science Theme of plants and made their own sycamore seeds and used tweezers to dissect flowers. Have a lovely weekend!

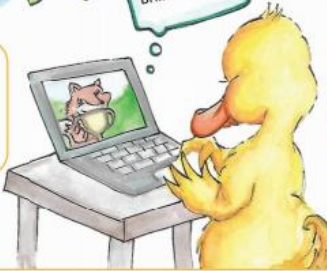

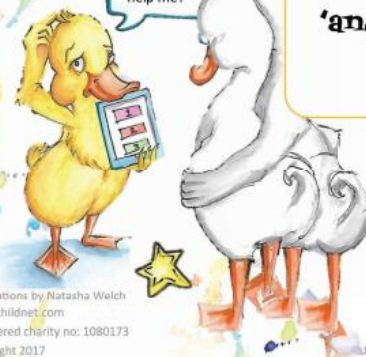
