Acorn/Birch Class Update

What a fantastic first half term of learning in Acorns and Birch class! Our reception children have been learning to recognise their first set of sounds and have started to orally blend words. This week's Drawing Club's book, Funnybones, has inspired some interesting conversations and outdoor learning, using fantastic vocabulary such as archaeologist and excavate! The children enjoyed finding bones in our sandpit, but we still haven't worked out whether they came from a dinosaur! We even had a visit from Keith the skeleton!

Birch have been enjoying reading 'Dragon Post' – we even had a secret message from the dragon itself!

In maths, Acorns have been exploring the number 5 and representing it in different ways. Year 1s have been learning about ordinal numbers (1st, 2nd, 3rd etc.) and the year 2s have been using part-part-whole models and bar models to partition 2-digit numbers.

If you have time, please remember to login to your child's Numbots account over the half-term holiday to practise their maths. Thank you for continuing to listen to your child read every day – it really does make a difference!

Chestnut Class Update

During the English learning this week, the children have continued to be inspired by the story 'The Last Bear'. They have used role play to help understand the relationship between April and her Dad, where they focused on freeze frames and speech. They have also made a fact file about polar bears as April and the Bear have become firm friends.

In Maths this week, the Yr 3/4 have focused on multiples of 10 and how to add and subtract through 100. They then used this knowledge to problem solve and work in partners – highlighting key information and using practical resources to help answer the questions. While the Yr 5/6 have looked at partition numbers up to 1,000,000 and how to compare numbers.

During Science, the Yr 3/4 children walked around the school identifying different seeds in our local areas and became botanists and took time to draw their favourite plant. Whereas the Yr 5/6 children had a great time experimenting with reactions between different liquids and bicarbonate soda, where they observed closely how much foam and mess each liquid made. In P.E the children ended their football unit with a match - putting in place all the skills they have learnt, which included attack, defence and working as a team.

Congratulations to the Yr 5/6 children, that completed the 3 fors challenge – you were BRILLIANT!

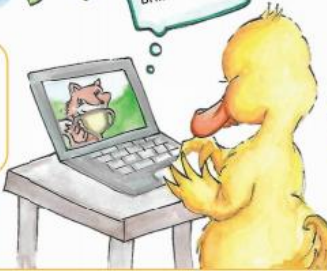

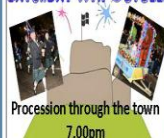

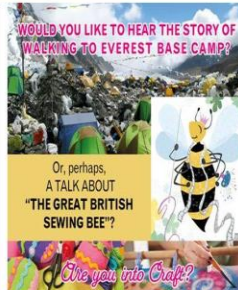
