Acorn/Birch Class Update


It's been a busy couple of week of learning in Acorns and Birch Class! Acorns have been exploring ice and learning about the South Pole, after reading 'Lost and Found' and 'Penguin' durina their Drawing Club sessions. Birch have been reading 'The Bear and the Piano' and have just started to plan their own version of the story.

We've seen some fantastic maths learning this week — from recognising numerals to 5 in Acorns, to counting in tens in Year 1, and partitioning numbers to make number bonds to ten in Year 2! We checked the results of our bread investigation in science this week and were amazed by what we discovered!

The children thoroughly enjoyed visiting the mobile library this week! They were so excited to borrow a book to bring home and share with you. We hope you've loved sharing their enthusiasm and discovering their chosen story together! Reading is one of the most important skills your child will develop, and those who read regularly with an adult at home make fantastic progress. Reading to your child is also a valuable part of their learning journey. Please add your initials to your child's reading record each time they read to you. Thank you so much for supporting this simple but powerful way to boost your child's learning across all areas.

Chestnut Class Update

During the English learning this week, the children have ben inspired by a new story 'The Barnabus Project', which is a beautifully illustrated story. The children have used expanded noun phrases and fronted adverbials to add detail to their writing. Also, they have learnt how to punctuate speech accurately and have included adverbs in their sentences.

The children have started a new story for Guided Reading, which is a classic- 'The Lion the Witch and the Wardrobe', where the children have immersed themselves in the story and have started learning about the famous characters – Susan, Peter, Edmund and Lucy.

In Maths learning this week, the Yr 3/4 children have focused on adding and subtraction across 100 – using known facts to answer questions mentally. Whereas the Yr 5/6 children have learnt different methods to multiply 2-digit numbers by 2 or 3-digit numbers by an efficient method. They have also focused on how to complete short division.

During their Science learning this week, the Yr 3/4 children went on a mini bug hunt around the school grounds and identified the kind of habitats they lived in. The Yr 5/6 children have started learning about space and created their own solar system following a set of instructions. Hope you have a great weekend!





Joyce returned to her war-time evacuation home in Boyton and reunited with a childhood friend to celebrate her 90th birthday.

When she arrived all those years ago, she was met by Bill Horrell. the billeting officer, and was brought back to Boyton Post Office

where she made her home with Bill and Elizabeth Horrell and their children Betty, Reg and Agnes.

After her arrival, Joyce attended Boyton Church Hall for school where she was helped to integrate into this alien rural community, before later moving into Boyton Primary School.

Finally, to round of the trip down memory lane, the pair paid a visit to The Old Post Office where Joyce and Agnes lived together from 1939 to 1945, marking the occasion with one final picture.


