Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you all had a wonderful half term break and were able to enjoy the glorious sunshine! We have had a fantastic first week back and are incredibly proud of the progress the children have made with their swimming. Over the four days, they have grown in confidence in the water and developed their swimming techniques brilliantly.

Well done to everyone – we are so pleased with their achievements!

Phonics Screening Check and Multiplication Check

At this time of year, our Year 1 children complete the **Phonics Screening Check** and our Year 4 pupils take part in the **Multiplication Tables Check**. These are both national assessments that all children undertake. The phonics check specifically assesses whether a child can decode words using their phonics skills. Children are asked to read a total of forty words—twenty 'real' words and twenty 'nonsense' words. The use of nonsense words ensures that children are applying their decoding skills rather than relying on memory! Evidence shows that the ability to decode words fluently is a crucial foundation for future reading success. Similarly, the multiplication check assesses both accuracy and speed in recalling times table facts. Having a rapid and secure recall of these facts is incredibly valuable, as it supports much of the mathematics children will encounter as they move through school, supporting their confidence and fluency in more complex calculations. We are very proud of our Y1s and 4s who have been working incredibly hard to develop their phonic and times table fluency!

We're hopeful about holding our Sports Day next week, weather permitting! Please bring some change with you as our amazing PTA will be selling drinks and ice creams!

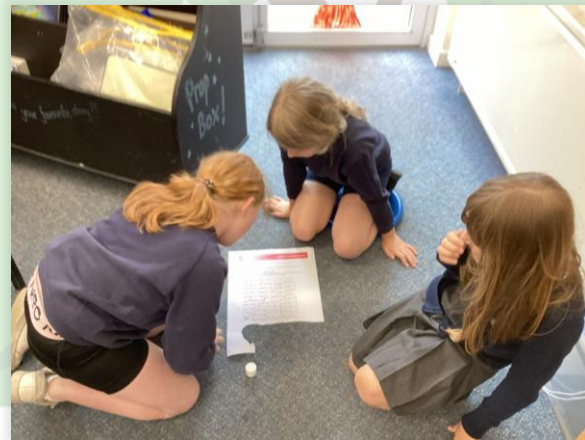
Chestnut Class Update

During English this week, we have started to look at a new text called 'Rumaysa', which is based on the traditional story of Rapunzel. The children have looked at different fairy tales and have written a persuasive piece making sure no one enters the woods, which have been cursed by the witch.

In Maths, this week we have had a focus on problem solving and the best way to tackle the problems. The children have worked in pairs and small groups to help share and compare ideas. In Science this week, the Yr 3/4 children focused on how the sun moves throughout the day and why the shadows move around the playground. Whereas the Yr 5/6 children investigated the effect of different surfaces and friction. They used ramps covered in different materials and measured the distance the cars travelled.

Well done to all of Chestnuts, who took part in swimming. They all made great progress and showed excellent listening skills and determination.
